**CIRCULAR**

**Subject:** Deemed The Approval of Registration, Licenses Under Contract Labour(Regulation and Abolition)Act, 1970, Inter-State Migrant Workmen (Regulation of Employment and conditions of service), Act, 1979 & The Building and Other Construction Workers (Regulation of Employment and conditions of service) Act, 1996.

**Reference:** 1.Implementation of State Business Reforms Action Plan, 2022.  
2.Review Meeting under the Chairmanship of Chief Secretary, Government of Karnataka on 28-07-2022.

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With respect to the above subject, on deemed approvals of Registration & Licences vide letter ref (1) Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade, Government of India has recommended to the States to adapt "A system to ensure that the license is issued electronically within forty-five days of the receipt of application failing which the license shall be deemed to be issued and shall be auto generated".

Regarding the Implementation of State Business Reforms Action Plan, 2022, a meeting was held on 28-07-2022 under the Chairmanship of Chief Secretary, Government of Karnataka, it was recommended to modify the Labour Department Online System for deemed approvals if application is not approved within prescribed SAKALA timeline for the following Acts.

1. Registration and License Under Contract Labour(Regulation and Abolition)Act, 1970:- Prescribed SAKALA timeline is 10 working Days

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2. Registration and License Under Inter-State Migrant Workmen

(Regulation of Employment and conditions of service), Act 1979: -

Prescribed SAKALA timeline is 10 working Days


3. Registration under The Building and Other Construction Workers

(Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1996: -

Prescribed SAKALA timeline is 10 working Days

Further NIC has been directed to make appropriate changes at the earliest in the software for deemed approval and auto generation of Certificates in case of pendency beyond prescribed timeline under SAKALA, and present the changes made in this regard to the Labour Commissioner at the earliest.

In view of above recommendation, the Labour Department has initiated all necessary changes in the online software system for deemed approval of applications under the above Acts, if the applications are not approved within prescribed SAKALA timeline. All the Officers concerned are hereby instructed to act on applications within the prescribed time limit under SAKALA.
